

# **Annual Koala Report for 2013-14**

### **Sightings**

The majority of our sightings are from September to April – the koala breeding season. The number of mothers with babies seen each year is an important tool for us to gauge the viability of our koala population. In Spring 2013, 5 mothers with babies were seen, as was the case in 2012. In 2011/2010/2009 we had 4, 3 and 3 babies respectively. This is a good trend for the recovery of our endangered population. One particularly good news story is that a mother with baby was seen in Winda Woppa in April last year and she is still being seen in the area. She has established Winda Woppa as her new home. Hopefully, this Spring there will be another new baby which will be the beginning of a resurgence of the koala population in Winda Woppa.

This year we have had slightly fewer numbers of sightings than last year: 184 (208 koalas) compared to 189 (218 koalas). The advertising of our Sightings Hotline phone number in the newspaper continues to help our sightings reports on the Hotline in Spring: 63% this year and 62% last year.

One significant shift in the sightings statistics has been that the "Magic Square" (52 koalas) was not where most koalas were seen this year but central Hawks Nest (88 koalas). Most sightings were in Yamba Street, Binda Street, Mermaid Avenue and Kurrawong Avenue. Swan Bay (24 Koalas) and North of Kingfisher Avenue (26 koalas) also had good sightings numbers. Not one koala was reported from Tea Gardens this year.

### **Koala Rescues**

There were three koala rescues in the past 12 months: two with a happy outcome and one not. In September we unsuccessfully attempted a rescue of a koala with very bad conjunctivitis in Pindimar Road (he eluded us) but then a month later, a Pindimar resident caught him and we took him into care. He was in care for a month and released, Chlamydia-free, in Clarke Street. In March a juvenile female koala was hit by a vehicle in the regular crossing point in Kingfisher Avenue near the Jean Shaw Koala Reserve but sadly died on the way to a carer. We ask all residents to please drive carefully in the stretch of Kingfisher Avenue between the bridge and Ibis Avenue. Later in March a young koala inadvertently strayed into a dogs yard in Hawks Nest and was attacked. Fortunately, his injuries were not fatal and a week later he was released in the Koala Reserve.

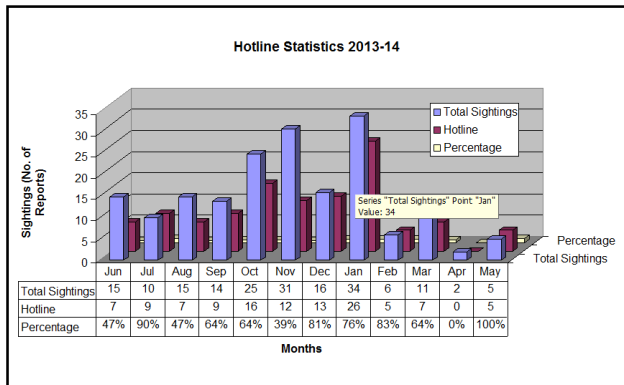
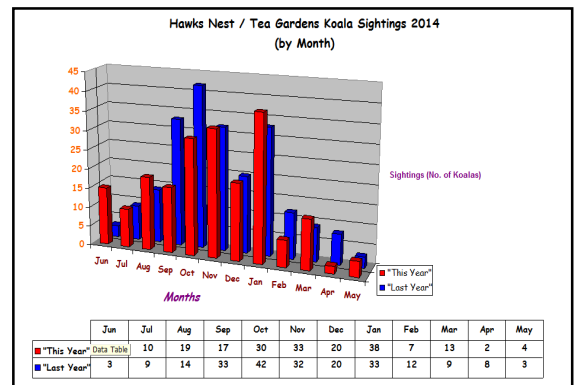
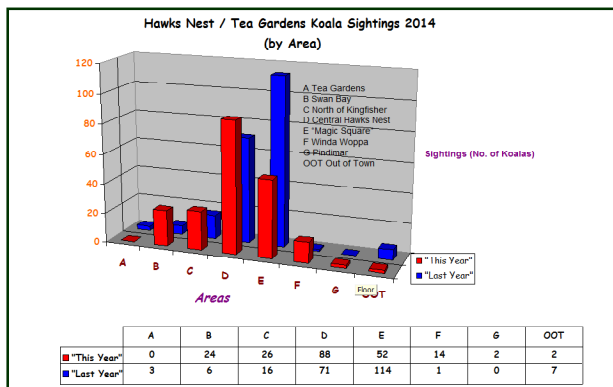
