This \$9k increase in our credit has come from member donations, Regional Aust Bank community partnership annual payment, Easter stall and raffle sales. The most significant figure was a single member donation of \$5k at the end of June.

The only major expenses have fallen in the current quarter. They are mostly made up of two items – a second donation of \$500 to PSKH approved at the last meeting, and a payment of \$363 to Glen Henry for creating a new A Frame for the group and updating the existing one for Bitou Busters bush regeneration working group.

Last year our major projects of a new website and tree guards and plaques for the NH Nature walk cost in excess of \$7000.

We now have the happy task of deciding what major projects and meaningful causes we support for the rest of the year.

PORT STEPHENS KOALA HOSPITAL (PSKH) OPENING

- Trish & Gorden Blair and Gail & Ian Morphett attended the official opening of the hospital at One Mile on the south side of Port Stephens last Thursday 11th August. The hospital has actually been operating for two years but the official opening was delayed by Covid.
- The hospital was opened by Federal Environment Minister Tanya Plibersek. Local Federal Member Meryl Swanson and local State Member Kate Washington were also official guests.
- It was announced that Peter Cockbain has donated \$1M to the hospital from the Cockbain Family Trust. Ms Plibersek confirmed that the Federal Government has granted \$3M to the hospital.
- Prior to the opening, Ron Land (PKH President) had advised Ian Morphett that Dr Ryan Witt from Newcastle Uni had recently carried out koala drone surveys on the Myall Coast. Ron said he would introduce Ian to Ryan at the opening. Ian and Ryan met at the opening and exchanged contact details. Ryan advised that he had been commissioned by MidCoast Council to carry out koala and dingo surveys in the Myall Lakes National Park and at the last minute was asked to survey the Jean Shaw Koala Reserve. Ryan found scattered koalas between Brambles Green and Johnsons Hill in the Park. The greatest concentration of koalas was near Seal Rocks. Unsurprisingly, none were found in the Jean Shaw Koala Reserve. Ian asked Ryan if he is prepared to give a talk (with videos) at a public meeting in Hawks Nest/Tea Gardens to which he agreed.

PORT STEPHENS SUSTAINABLE FUTURES FESTIVAL

- Port Stephens EcoNetwork is holding this Festival at St Philip's Christian College at Salamander Bay on 11 September. www.econetworkps.org/sustainable-futures
- Our committee members have supported the event by (personally) purchasing raffle tickets to help finance the event.
- We have decided not to have a stall at the event because we can't see any particular benefit to us and the participation requirements are a bit honorous.
- The secretary is to send an email to members providing details about the event for those who may wish to attend.

PINDIMAR/BUNDABAH COMMUNITY ASSOC MARKET DAY

- We were invited by the Association to have a stall at the Market Day on October 29 October.
- Because the Myall River Festival is not on this year, we decided to have a stall (no fee).
- At the event we will give away koala food trees, natives and communicate with the community.
- Trish Blair advised that trees and some natives have been organised with MidCoast Council's plant nursery.
- Adrienne Ingram advised that Market Day is a bit "down market" with beer tasting and thong throwing and won't have as much passing traffic as the River Festival.
- Richard Streamer suggested that, if we have trees and plants left over, we could have a stall at the Providores Market in the Industrial Estate or perhaps Woodwards Nursery.

RED CROSS LADIES LUNCH

• We have been invited to send representatives to this luncheon celebrating "Women in Service" at Palm Lake Resort on Thursday 8th September. One representative is the give a short talk describing what our group does.

- The Secretary is to advise the Red Cross that we will have two attendees.

NEW GROUP A-FRAME

- For some time the Committee has been debating the design of an A-frame for us to use at events in which we are participating. Adrienne and Glen Henry (the sign creator) have been very patient with us and the many revisions. Finally, a design was agreed.
- Adrienne had the new A-frame at the meeting and everyone agreed it is excellent!

DOLPHIN STATUE UPDATE

- A wire-frame statue of a dolphin about 5-feet tall was donated to us by a Melbourne artist. It was transported to us by Neil Smith who "happened" to be returning to Hawks Nest from Melbourne.
- We intend to fill the statue with plastic and other waste items and have a sign that warns of the consequences of waste entering the waterways.
- Richard Streamer has been negotiating with Council to erect the sign in the park adjacent to the Surf Club. Council requires us to mount it 2m above ground to avoid vandalism and seek support from the Surf Club, Progress Assoc and Lions Club.
- Rob Hughes has agreed to investigate a suitable pole to erect the statue on as well as mesh to line it with.
- Artwork for a number of potential signs was circulated. Jane Collison and Deb will work on sign design.
- Richard will approach those community groups and continue to negotiate with Council.



- A DA has just been lodged with Council for a 342 site Caravan Park on the eastern side of Mungo Brush Road (the THIRD one on Mungo Brush Road). Council is currently working on a new Rural Strategy for inclusion in a new LGA-wide Local Environment Plan (LEP) for MidCoast. This strategy will not permit caravan parks on rural land but the current Great Lakes LEP in effect allows caravan parks. The proponent presumably is trying to get approval before the new LEP. Ian Morphett has spoken to manager of planning at MCC and he is not in favour of the DA but can't prevent a develop submitting a DA. There are many flaws in the DA so hopefully the assessment can be delayed until the new DA comes into force.
- Sheargold held public information sessions in June about their proposed Parry's Cove Marina fronting the Myall River. A number of our members attended sessions. Sheargold were seeing community feedback on their proposal. Until a DA is lodged, we didn't want to get too detailed in our feedback but we did communicate our concerns about a marina at such a narrow part of the river.
- In late June we submitted a 5-page submission objecting to the four storey development adjacent to the pub on Marine Drive/Myall Street. Secretary is to offer to the members to send them the full submission if they would like a copy.





FUTURE PROJECTS DISCUSSION

- Richard Streamer advised that we have received a \$5,000 donation from Rosemary Lucas. He said we should try to come up with a specific project to allocate the funds to, similar to the John Davis Memorial Walk in Sanderling Avenue.
- One suggestion was for signage to identify where Bitou Busters bush regeneration work is carried out.
- Another was to have koala drone surveys of the Myall Coast region done.
- It was decided that we really need to do more in-depth thinking on the topic and to seek ideas from all our members.
